We should stand with victims of terrorism in the same way that we sta

of crimes committed in Australia.

Since September 2001, hundreds of Australian families have been impeterrorist events in New York, Bali, Jakarta, London and Mumbai.

These Australians were not eligible for compensation to aid them in th their grief.

Currently, victims of violent crime in Australia can receive compensation \$75,000 from various state victims of crime schemes.

In 2012 when the Government agreed to provide the victims of terroris compensation, it only did so for future victims and not the existing vict

Having first raised this matter in 2009 and having introduced private machieve justice, the government's behaviour towards the victims of terr spirited. I had always hoped that the Parliament would consider the machine bipartisan way and that it would reflect the best of our political process.

If elected, a Coalition government will within 100 days introduce legisla start date for eligibility 10 September 2001.

The victims of terrorism still face obstacles – both physical and emotic Our commitment to the Australian victims of terrorism is a modest builtiative.

About 300 individuals and families will benefit from this commitment to compensation of up to a maximum of \$75,000. The cost of our commit victims of terrorism is about \$30 million.
